People have lived in what we now call Stepney since about a thousand years before the birth of Christ. It is thought that the first church was built here sometime between St Augustine's conversion of the English in the 6th century, and 952 when a second church was erected on the site by St Dunstan. The existing building is the third on the site and was built of Kentish ragstone

mainly in the 15th century (although the chancel dates from 200 years earlier). A porch and octagonal parish room were added in 1872.
